1.0 INTRODUCTION

Valuers Registration Board is a public body corporate established under Section 12 of the Valuation and Valuers Registration Act (Cap 138) to regulate valuation undertakings in the country. The main functions of the Board include registration of Valuers after evaluating their academic and practical qualification, promotion of educational advancement of Valuers and control valuation practice in the country. Before enactment of Valuation and Valuers Registration Act No.7 of 2016, Valuers in Tanzania were registered by National Council of Professional Surveyors under the Professional Surveyors (Registration) Act, 1977 as Land Economy Surveyors. Thus, Act No.7 of 2016 established the Valuers Registration Board under Section 12 and 13. The Board was formed in 2018 and commenced its operations the same year. Board has targeted to register 2500 Valuers and increase professional capacity of 2700 by 2026.

1.1 Board's Functions

Board's functions, as stipulated in Section 14 of the Valuation and Valuers Registration Act, No.7 of 2016, are, to register Valuers; Issue certificate to persons qualified to practice valuation; evaluate academic and practical qualification of Valuers for purposes of registration; exercise effective disciplinary control of valuation practice; consult with institutions that train Valuers with the view to ensuring adherence to rules of the best practice; organise courses, conferences, seminars, discussions and consultations on matters relating to valuation; conduct regular professional education; arrange for publication and dissemination of materials regarding the practice of valuation; conduct regular quality control of valuations carried out by practising Valuers at a frequency determined by the Board and take appropriate action; and carry out such other functions as the Minister responsible for lands may direct.

1.2 The Role of Valuation Profession and the Board

Valuation plays a key role in facilitating many economic transactions. The profession has an important role in facilitating transactions in the financial services sector. Such transactions include mortgages, insurance, accounting and

auditing, investments in real estate, selling and buying of properties, use by taxation authorities in taxation and other land-based transactions. Together with the financial sector, other stakeholders include central government, local government authorities, public and private institutions, non-governmental organizations and judiciary all of which benefit from valuation services.

The role of the Board in valuation profession and valuation practice on the other hand cannot be underestimated, as it protects the interests of each party in a valuation undertaking; provides platform for addressing matters of ethics and professional misconduct on valuation practice; protects valuation profession against unprofessional practices; consolidates and disseminates information about reliable valuation consultants; brings Valuers together in matters of professional advancement, and assist Government authorities on matters of valuation practice.

1.3 Annual Timetable 2024/2025 Preparation:

The almanac for 2024/2025 took into consideration the objectives and targets to be achieved in this financial year. These includes the need to evaluate academic and practical qualifications of Valuers and get them registered at full registration level; Prepare and approve important management instruments needed in the day to day management of Board's activities; conduct sufficient seminars and workshops for the academic advancement of Valuers; conduct meetings with stake holders to get them in line with Board's legal mandates; and ensure that Board's Strategic Plan (2021/2022 – 2025/2026) which takes into account the National Development Plans and Ruling Party Manifesto is implemented accordingly.

The Board's almanac also covers all important management aspects including Committees meetings, Boards meetings, public notifications of the practicing Valuers and Valuation consulting firms and all matters related to candidate's examination and registration. It is arranged in terms of main activities of the Board in each month.
